Overview of Academic Major

Within the 144 credits required for a degree, students complete a total of 48 credits in European Studies and 15 credits second foreign language courses. Additional degree requirements are fulfilled by 54 credits of General Education and 27 elective credits (these may be chosen from additional European Studies courses, other departmental courses or courses counting towards a minor). All students are required to successfully complete a Senior Thesis, TOEFL, as well as a State Subject Exam in Second Foreign Language (FRN or GER) and the History of Kyrgyzstan exam.

These courses are designed for Juniors and Seniors with the goal of preparing them for the State exam in the Second Language.

*These ES courses in German and French could be counted as Humanities GE requirements.

Academic Minor in European Studies

The European Studies department offers to non ES students an opportunity to obtain a minor degree in European Studies. In order to start studying for minor in ES, a student must obtain permission from the chair of his/her department and the chair of ES department.

To apply for minor, students must have GPA 2.5 or higher.

To earn the Minor degree in ES, students must complete at least 24 credits from the ES department. Thereby, 60% of course credits must be taken from the upper level courses. Only the courses with a grade "C" or higher will be counted towards the fulfilment of minor requirements.

To obtain the degree in ES as minor students must take a maximum of 3 credits from the 100 level required courses. A minimum of 6 credits must be taken from 200 and 300 level required courses. A maximum of 3 credits must be taken from the 300 level elective courses.

A maximum of 12 credits must be taken in the second foreign language (French or German or Spanish).
