Mid-term exam (15 % of grade) 8 week

Exam will consist of 2 essay questions which will cover class topics.

Reflection paper (10% of grade)

Paper (2,3 pages) should reflect an outline of the article, main points and problems positioned by the author, merits and limitations, importance for contemporary anthropology and impact on student's understanding.

Video presentation (10 % of grade) 14-16 weeks, is a creative video movie (10-15 minutes) carried out by students team (up to 2 students) reflecting one of the course topic, with clear plot and critical insights.

Final paper (group work, 2 students) (7-9 pages, 12, Times New Roman, 1,5 space): 25 points

This should be a library research based on class topics with evaluation of the state of field and critique.
