VIRTUAL DEBATE TAUGHT ME A LOT

I am a sophomore in the software engineering department at AUCA and actively engaged in virtual events. Every semester, AUCA and AUN organize inter-university virtual meetings and discuss different motives. Last year the discussion was held on December 4th, where students engaged in the conversation on selected topics. On November 26th, 2022, I had an opportunity to participate in the 7th Inter-University Virtual Discussion between AUN and AUCA. Ms. Emilienne Akpan (AUN) and Ms. Ekaterina Galimova (AUCA) initiated this meeting within the Civic Engagement Project Crossing Borders Through Social Media and Dialogue. The topic for the debate was "The problem of female slavery in Central Asia and Nigeria."

We shared our ideas regarding this issue and discussed ways of eliminating female enslavement. Besides this, three break rooms were created with a separate topic for each. The first breakdown room debated if Women Should Be Paid Less than Men in Some Professions, the second room discussed if The Internet Should Be Shut Down During The Class Hours in all Universities and another room negotiated about Technology Facilitates Modern


Slavery. I was part of the second breakdown room and defended the argument about shutting down the internet at universities during classes. Shervobshoh Tuighunov, a student from the American University of Nigeria, rebutted my argument and added that if we shut down the internet during class hours, students will not get access to google, which is the main source of receiving information for students. Contrary, I argued that if students are busy with the internet, it will create a sense of isolation, and each will learn in his/her manner.

I agree that students will learn faster and find a piece of valuable information in less time if they have access to the internet during class hours. However, it will distract them from the professor's lecture, and they will not interact with other students. Additionally, they would not build their critical thinking skill since they will use the internet to answer the professor's question before analyzing it themselves. I also added if students did not find any information, they could take notes and figure it out after the class by searching online. It will also help students in improving their conversational writing. In summary, I argued that only professors should have access to

the internet during class hours. If there is an excuse to use the internet, students can ask a professor for help.

Hearing the slave and slavery words takes us back to the late 18th century when Atlantic slavery trading reached its peak. While the world welcomed the International Day for the Abolition of Slavery on the 2nd of December, it is shocking to mention that slavery has not ended in the 21st century. Instead, it just has been transformed in a modern way, making it difficult to notice until we dig deeper. Unfortunately, women are the main victims of this new face of slavery in the present time. Getting influence from this, the 7th virtual meeting between the American University of Central Asia (AUCA) and the American University of Nigeria (AUN) took place on the 26th of November to mainly discuss the ways to eliminate female slavery in present times.

Students from both universities identified the modern ways of slavery in their countries, Afghanistan, Kyrgyzstan, Nigeria, China, Tajikistan, and Uzbekistan. It was wondrous that all students came up with the same contemporary forms of modern female slavery, showing that despite the geographical places, cultural, language and religious differences, women experience the same kind of present-time slavery. Students described modern slavery in

many forms, such as child marriage, forced marriage, forced labor, sex trafficking, and domestic servitude, which is a type of forced labor where a person is available 24 hours for another person's service. It was very dreadful hearing about the debt bandage form of women's slavery, where women will be given to the lender if the borrower is not able to pay the debt principle, typically using women as personal assets.

Among the ways to be paved to eliminate female slavery in modern times, educating women and making them financially independent was the most repeated solution discussed. Furthermore, putting the government's role forward, the members of the meeting stated that government should create a law to eliminate women's slavery. Specifically, an anti-child marriage law, and anyone not obeying this law, should be punished. Also, the government should create more job opportunities for women with equal payment for their work. Another discussed solution was raising awareness about women's slavery in society by the government and other organizations, and encouraging the victims to speak up and launch the anti-slavery movements.

The most interesting solution which got my attention was involving private NGOs in the anti-slavery movement by creating references where the slavery victims could reach out for help and get empowered. Then these empowered victims can identify the reasons for slavery through their experiences and start anti-slavery movements strongly and efficiently.

As a host, it was a tragedy for me to hear some female students arguing against the equal pay law of females and males in the workplace, claiming that men are usually the bread owner of families. Thus, they should be paid more than females. But one should never blame women for undermining their own power and abilities and label them as anti-own gender. For centuries women have been treated as a second gender and they believe it till these days. Indeed, if the vision is a world free of women's slavery, education and empowering women should be the goal.
