Grading scale for final appraisement is standard:

A = 90-100%

A-, B+, B = 60-89%

B-, C, C+ = 40-59%

C-, D = 20-39%

F = 19% and below

The general criteria of grading policy to final exam in Minor are associated to general requirements of the American University - Central Asia. A minimal grade for exam to be considered for a minor should be "C".
