**POLICY ON MINOR IN LAW  
for 2012 admits and those who enters later**

The Minor in Law program is designed for non-law students who want to get more knowledge in law since the latter is becoming necessary for any specialists while the country is moving toward the rule of law and market economy. Two concentrations are offered: Public Law and Business Law.

A total 42 credits comprised of courses required for all concentrations, and courses required for certain concentration and electives.

To receive a minor in Law students must have permission of their department chair and the chair of the International and Business Law (IBL) Department. Students must have a GPA of 3.0 or higher and a "B" grade or above in all courses in their major that will count towards the minor.

**To obtain a permission of the Chair of the IBL Department for the minor in law, a student shall submit the following documents:**

- Application letter requesting consideration for a transfer (заявление)
- Copy of current transcript
- TOEFL score (500)
